Pastor's Note

On Sunday we celebrate Easter ... the best day of the year! Jesus' resurrection is what fills my life with hope! I no longer have to live in the ruts I've been in. I am free to live and give choosing bold over mild ... fun over drudgery ... and uncharted territory rather than the safety of the familiar. On my best days ... (not every day am I at my best) ... I can fully engage real life over blah existence. And on my not so good days I am dependant on the unbounded love and grace of God from which I will never be separated! WOW! What a day is Easter!

One of the greatest gifts we have from God is our personal experience with the living Christ. While our experience with Jesus is personal, it is never private. We are called and challenged by God to use every gift for God's higher purposes. Our personal and life changing experience with Christ is a gift God calls us to use. In this Easter season ... how exciting it would be if we could be bold stewards of our gift and share our personal experience of Christ with another person. Who knows how someone else's life might change?

Our Stewardship Team is sending out to all of us and to many who have visited our church in the last several years a card inviting folk to our weekly celebrations of worship. Several from our Evangelism team are putting invitations on every door in the historic Naperville area that surrounds our church. These are acts of radical hospitality ... sharing the risen Christ and being good and faithful stewards of our witness.

The resurrection of Christ was a bold move on God's part. Now it is our turn to be bold. Here's the challenge:

- Make a list of 5 to 10 people you know who are not attending any church.
- Over the next several weeks pray for the people on that list.
- Watch for any opportunity to invite (and bring) someone from your list to worship.

Last year in June we increased worship attendance by 7% focusing on our stewardship of presence. Over the next 6 weeks let's shoot for a minimum of 10% growth. Christ lives ... and that's too fantastic to keep to ourselves!

Stewardship

Dollars and Sense

When the subject of Stewardship comes up, the thousand pound gorilla in the room is often financial giving. Much has been spoken and written on the topic, some of value and other information less helpful. A **great discussion** took place at the Administrative Board meeting in March with members and attendees offering their input, particularly with respect to personal decision-making on the needs one chooses to support. Here are some of the thoughts shared, together with a couple not mentioned but worth adding to the list -

- Before an informed decision can be made on how much to contribute and to what cause, it's important to understand the level of need and how the money will be used.
- Prayerful consideration, along with asking revealing questions, is a great place to begin your process of evaluation.
- A key element in decision-making is the relevance of a particular cause to you – and relevance leads to resonance.
- While the amount given is certainly important to both the giver and recipient cause, the **decision to act** is the most critical part of the process.
- Here's the tricky part. Financial pleas at CUMC are not made without forethought and all have some level of merit. *However*, it is not necessary or expected that members and attendees support all causes – or selected causes equally. Give what you can and where you can – and feel good about it!
- It is understood that Community Church – and its various programs – is not the only worthy cause around. We do hope that it holds a special, elevated place in your life with respect to what you support.

Going forward, the Administrative Board will be working with the various groups and ministry teams at our church to create a calendar involving financial initiatives to reduce overlap and conflict that might otherwise take place. It is too simplistic to simply state that all needs expressed at CUMC are worthy of support. Please know that work is going on behind the scenes to make your decision-making a less stressful process, particularly during this time of financial challenge for many individuals and families. Our God is a generous and understanding God. He knows that we need to take care of *our own needs* – not the same as wants – as we respond to the *needs of others*.

Sound System Update

At the request of members of our congregation, the Trustees have been discussing concerns about the sound system in the CUMC sanctuary. We realize this involves more than just the sound system and how the speakers are directed. While we are working on tweaking the sound system, we also want to work on the problem from the standpoint of members of the congregation with some degree of hearing impairment. Of course, we know that hearing impairment varies in nature and degree. At this time, we want to gain a better understanding of the concerns of our hearing impaired members so that we can come up with plans that will improve the ability of *all* our members to participate in services to the maximum extent possible.

Sylvia Kupferer and Nancy Whittington have agreed to take responsibility for working with our members who are experiencing problems with hearing in the sanctuary and of proposing ways to approach the problem. Our important first step will be to identify members of the congregation who are hearing impaired and others who want to be a part of the work group that will look at the problems identified and propose possible solutions.
